As a law enforcement officer, you can expect to come into contact with people who are deaf or hard of hearing. Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 prohibits State and local government from discriminating against and individual with a disability. In addition, bomb threats cause disruption of air, land and sea commerce and pose an unacceptable danger to the traveling public and should be resolved quickly. Explosives detection canine teams are a proven reliable resource to detect explosives and are a key component in a balanced counter-sabotage program. Canine teams consist of a fully trained and certified Transportation Security Administration owned canine and a canine handler from the participating agency. 
