### "Electronic Recording of Custodial Interrogations: Everybody Wins"

This document, compiled by the AELE Law Enforcement Legal Center for the IACP 2006 Conference, describes the benefits relating to electronically recording custodial interrogation proceedings. According to Alan Harris, a veteran prosecutor in Minnesota, it was "the best thing we've ever had rammed down our throats." He was referring to a practice that the Minnesota Supreme Court imposed on the state's police officers more than a decade ago -- the electronic recording of custodial interrogations in felony investigations from the time that the Miranda warnings are given until the end of the interviews. ### "Property and Evidence Control"

This policy is taken from the Whitehall Township, Pennsylvania, Bureau of Police. It is the policy of the Whitehall Township Bureau of Police to ensure evidence and/or recovered property in custody is properly secured, stored, and readily retrievable. Additionally, any changes in the custody of the evidence and/or recovered property are properly and fully documented. 
