It reflects the groundwork laid in 2003 and the progress and new needs encountered since. The new edition of the Strategic Plan reaffirms our commitment to our community and our employees, delivering the highest quality police service to the Municipality of Anchorage. "Civil Liability and Domestic Violence Calls -- Part One"

Officers sometimes have arrived at the scene of a domestic disturbance only to find that things have supposedly "calmed down," or to find that their very presence appears to have had the effect of bringing a lull to the hostilities. There have also, however, been instances in which the officers then leave, only to later find that the violence has recommenced in their absence, and resulted in serious bodily harm, the death of one person, or even multiple homicides, sometimes combined with a suicide. This first part of a three-article series examines an important U.S. Supreme Court decision on the constitutional parameters of police obligations in responding to domestic violence, and how federal courts have analyzed the issue in the context of a "state-created danger" doctrine.
