"New Study: TASERs "As Safe As Weapons Can Be," Not "Instruments of Death"

Self-described as "kind of a nerd" who approaches tedious research as recreation, Chief Howard Williams of the San Marcos (TX) PD patiently tracked down and analyzed 213 cases in which suspects in the U.S. died after being TASERed. The search took more than a year and cost thousands from his own pocket, but in the end Williams has documented what TASER supporters have long believed: These devices are "safe weapons. At least they are as safe as weapons can be." This document is located in the Core Database under document #598635.


