This brochure was created by the Bureau of Justice Assistance. Statistics show that more than twice as many peace officers die because of suicide than are killed in the line of duty. All police officers have firearms, and firearms are the most frequently used means of suicide. Law enforcement suicide significantly impacts partners, colleagues, supervisors, first responders, family, friends and the community at large.
